JARC's Making Community Connections (MCC) program promotes community inclusion by helping people with disabilities join community clubs and organizations as full members, and to make friends with others in the club. Following the expiration of an initial grant from the Jewish Fund, JARC has now received a generous gift from the **Dale and Bruce Frankel/Jo Elyn and George Nyman Making Community Connections Fund** to continue this very successful program.

Overseen by **Kristi Davis**, JARC's Recreation Coordinator and certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist, the MCC program is staffed by community guides who assess an individual's interests and then try to find a match within the community. According to Kristi, "The guide may visit many prospective

sites to ensure a good fit. Once the bond between friends is comfortable and secure, JARC recedes and a long-lasting, reciprocal relationship remains."

JARC has now facilitated 50 community connections, including these success stories:

Julie has been a long-standing member of the Motor City Camera Club. She recently shot an image of a burning candle and won second place in two juried photo contests. Her friends in the club could not be more proud of her accomplishments.

'Raise The Roof' Raises Major Funds for Medow Home Makeover



On October 15, 2010, JARC undertook a campaign, chaired by **Joanne and Danny Aronovitz**, to fund major renovations for the Shirley T. Medow Home in Huntington Woods. By December 31, the total raised was \$132,455! Shortly before construction began, a Graffiti Party was held at the home giving 80 enthusiastic supporters an opportunity to leave their autograph and original artwork on the home's old walls.

In an effort to meet the current and future needs of the six women who live at the Medow Home, the makeover project will involve installing a new geothermal heating and cooling system, a barrier-free kitchen with high-efficiency appliances and lighting, construction of a new three-season porch, roof and driveway repairs, the planting of native landscaping, and the use of eco-friendly paint.

In addition to many individual gifts from Huntington Woods residents and others, the project received major donations from **Adam Becker's** company, **Statewide Disaster Restoration**, **MASCO Corporation**, and **Granite Transformations**. Grants from **United Way** and **Community Housing Network** completed the project's funding. A formal "re-dedication" of the new Medow Home will take place this summer.

In 2004, they established an endowment fund, the **Kaufman Family Sports and Recreation Fund**.

Used to promote the health and fitness of the people in JARC's homes and programs through adapted recreation and leisure-time activities, the Kaufman Family Sports and Recreation Fund enables JARC to offer programs such as exercise, swimming and yoga classes. It also supports the JARC/JCC Sports For All Picnic and helps to purchase tickets to sporting events.

Before last year's fall fundraiser, Sue and Alan Kaufman made another commitment to JARC – to match dollar-for-dollar all new gifts and increased gifts made by donors over the previous year's amounts. The result was an additional \$100,000 to the Kaufman Family Sports and Recreation Fund. According to Sue, "We believe that sports and recreational activities can contribute to a person's sense of well-being and improve their overall health. We are gratified to know that we can directly impact the lives of the people served by JARC and perhaps we will inspire others to do the same."

New Voices Heard at JARC



Twenty-five men and women from JARC's **Independent Living Services (ILS)** program turned out for the kick-off meeting of a new forum, to be known as *"The Voice of ILS"*. The group will meet at regular intervals and participants will have the opportunity to determine which types of trainings and information will be most valuable to them in leading independent lives.

From input gathered at the first meeting, participants were mailed a questionnaire asking them to choose which courses and classes they prefer. The choices included topics such as: basic CPR/First Aid; internet safety; home maintenance; fitness, bike riding and personal training, energy savings; and, vacation destination ideas.

Penny Todd, Assistant Director of Department of Community Supports, remarked, "We will draw on many of JARC's 'in-house' resources to provide some of the classes and try to bring in expert speakers. We hope to offer 6 classes, and a certificate of completion will be awarded to anyone who completes 4 of the 6 classes. 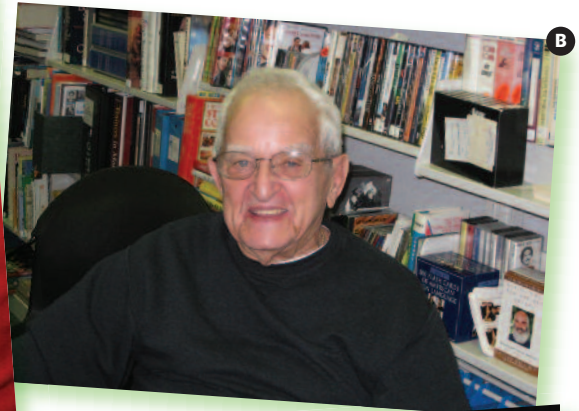
